Michigan currently has no OFR legislation in place SB 1080 was introduced in summer 2022




2,738 lives lost to an overdose in 2020\*

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To Our Business Partners:

In 2020, there were 1027 nonfatal drug overdoses reported by emergency departments in Muskegon County. An additional 57 people lost their lives in the same time-period, which is an 84% increase over 2010 fatalities. Most of these fatal and nonfatal overdoses were caused by a prescribed or illegally obtained opioid.

Many of these deaths could be prevented through prompt access to the medication naloxone hydrochloride,
